

Mission and Christian growth are the main goals of each Unit. United Methodist Women is a great way to experience faith building, help with mission work and develop lasting friendships.


We are looking for an Experienced pool Maintenance worker! Mary Welch is in need of someone to come and maintain her pool this summer. If you are that person, or know someone that is please call

Boil 1/2 a bag of wide egg noodles till almost done. Drain mix together 1 jar alfredo sauce and 1 8 oz bag of imitation crab or lobster pieces and fresh herbs such as basil or parsley. 1 Tbs. finely minced Add to the noodles and place in a 9 x 11 greased casserole dish. Top with 1/2 cup mozzarella and some seasoned bread crumbs. (make you own with your Little Oscar).

Cover with foil and bake in a 350 Deg. over for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake 10 minutes longer or till slightly browned. If you let it go longer the noodles get hard.


## Senior Luncheon




## Buy a Church Shirt to Send "A Kid to Camp"


